CDBG is a vital resource to our community, providing funding for local projects and services that directly impact the lives of our low- and moderate-income citizens. For example, some important projects funded in Lexington County with CDBG have included the following:

- CDBG funds in the amount of **\$10,409,723** were spent on public improvements, such as the development and improvements of fire stations, law enforcement centers, street and sidewalk improvements, water and sewer improvements, and neighborhood/community facilities.
- CDBG funds in the amount of **\$512,783** were spent on public services, such as services for senior and youth projects, health services, employment training, services for abused and neglected children, and services for the disabled.
- CDBG funds in the amount of **\$955,449** were provided for housing activities, such as, housing rehabilitation and the construction of affordable housing.


